CAC turned 10 in 2023! And over those years, we have donated over £500.000 to cancer research around the world.

We decided to celebrate with an anniversary T shirt, echoing the commemorative one that marked our founder

John Ellison's passing, which said 'Keep smiling'.

The anniversary version says 'Still smiling 10 years on'. The F*CK CANCER middle finger on the back certainly seems to strike a chord! We've had an amazing response, often selling out at different events. Online sales alone have brought in over £8.000 so far!

Ten-year grants

As a reminder, and to mark our 10th anniversary, we aim to give £10,000 each to 10 deserving organisations, ideally on every continent.

So far, we have presented 3 cheques, in Monaco, the UK and Serbia. The Trustees recently agreed to also fund projects in Nepal, Tanzania, Canada, the US and France. More detail and photos to follow!

Jessica Baker, in memoriam

A keen young climber and supporter of CAC, Jessica was tragically killed when her school bus was involved in an accident last year. She was only 15. An online tribute page was set up by her family, asking that contributions be made to CAC. Incredibly, over £6,500 was raised, and a sponsored teachers' karaoke at her school added a further £1,300.

Altogether, £6,747 were raised and presented at The Climbing Works International Festival (CWIF), where some of our ambassadors 'just happened' to be competing... More details in our article.

Also at the CWIF they presented a £7,568 cheque at the **CWIF** from September's Global Awareness Month in collaboration with **Prostate Cancer** Research.
